Immigration Reform Background

- Our immigration system is badly broken.
- Currently 11.5 Million undocumented immigrants living in this country many with families and jobs.
- Our legal immigration system is outdated and inefficient -- holding our economy back and keeping citizens away from their families for too long.
- Right now, it's too easy for businesses to knowingly employ undocumented workers--exploiting the system to gain advantage over businesses that are playing by the rules.
- And we need to continue to improve our border security and infrastructure.
- All of these things can be accomplished by passing comprehensive immigration reform legislation.



The Fight in the Senate

- Shortly after the 2012 elections, a bipartisan group of eight Senators (known as the "Gang of Eight") began crafting a comprehensive immigration bill. They revealed their bill in April, 2013.
- The President laid out his vision for reform the included better border security, cracking down on businesses that knowingly hired undocumented immigrants, streamlining our legal immigration system, and creating a pathway to citizenship.
- Several months of hard campaigning followed across the country pressing Senators to support the bill.
- On June 27th, 2013, the US Senate passed a comprehensive immigration reform bill with support from Senators from both parties

Reform Moves to the House

- After the Bill passed the Senate, it moved to the House, where Speaker Boehner has not brought it up for a vote for over a year. Discharge petition: http://thinkprogress.org/immigration/2014/04/02/3422085/190-discharge-immigration/
- Most observers believe that if at any time over the past year, there has been bipartisan support to pass a bill, but Speaker Boehner has refused to act, held hostage by extreme members of his caucus.
- If a vote were held even today, we believe that it has the support to pass.
- And we know the majority of Americans continue to support immigration reform.
