Status of the economic recovery, including the June 2014 jobs report (May 2014 for IL data)

- We are recovering, but we haven't fully recovered yet. Labor Force up 1,631,000 since Jan 2008; Marginally attached up 300,000 since January 2008 (1.7 million).
- Don't put too much emphasis on a single monthly report. Look instead at longer term trends. (Except for you stock traders).
- We set a new private sector jobs record in March and set a new total jobs record in May
 - i. This is not complete recovery nationally, but still a significant milestone nonetheless. A full recovery nationally will likely occur in 2015.
 - ii. IL's recovery is lagging the national recovery by about two years.

- iii. 288,000 jobs added in June;
- iv. April and May employment revised up by 29,000 jobs
- Unemployment rate nationally down to 6.1% in June, and continues to trend down from its high of 10.0% in October 2009...
- IL unemployment rate was 7.5% in April, down from 7.9% in March, 8.4% in March and 8.7% in Feb and trending down from its high of 11.4%
- Conservatives talking point this month is that part time jobs were up 799,000 in June on a seasonally adjusted basis.
